Cavalier High School Art Gallery Initiative

The Cavalier High School Art Gallery is a project that was presented to the Red River RC&D Council by the Cavalier Arts and Crafts Society. This project created a new art gallery in the hallway in the Cavalier High School's front entrance. Pieces of art from students created since the 1980's that have been in storage for many years and underutilized were placed in display cases in the hallway to create the current Cavalier High School Art Gallery.



Art education plays an important role in the student curriculum at the Cavalier High School. It fosters self-discipline and confidence and imparts a sense of pride in self-expression. Each year the Cavalier High School holds a spring art show to showcase the range of artwork and talent among the students. At the spring art show, at least one talented student is given honors and receives a spot in the art gallery to display their artwork. The art gallery also has a display for local artists in the community to showcase their talents. This display is changed on a monthly basis.

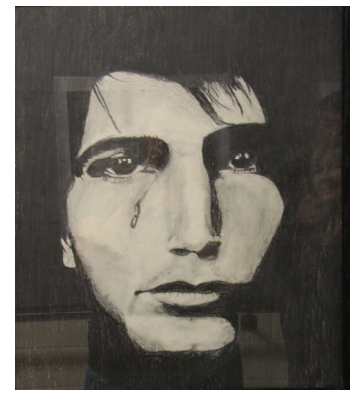

The total cost of the project was approximately \$8,500. Additional improvements are being planned for the future.
