

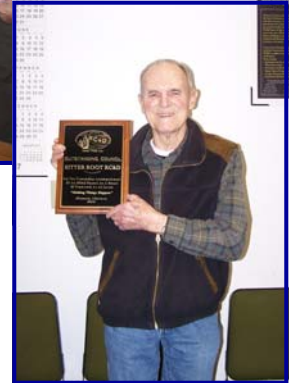
Bitter Root Resource Conservation & Development Area, Inc.
